On behalf of Hong Kong China Rugby (HKCR), I would like to extend a warm welcome to everyone gathered here today for the 56th New Year's Day Youth Rugby Tournament. This tournament is always one of the highlights of our rugby calendar and serves as an exciting way to kick off the New Year.

During the past twelve months we have seen some remarkable performances by our representative teams and match officials, in particular the historic Gold and Bronze medals which our Men's and Women's Sevens teams brought back from the Hangzhou Asian Games. The Men's Sevens team also retained their Asia Rugby Sevens Series title and were recognized as the Team of the Year at the Cathay Sports Star Awards.

It was also excellent to see both our Men's and Women's

Fifteens teams back in action throughout the year, with the Men's team winning the Asia Rugby Championship for the fourth time, as well as securing two excellent victories against Germany in November. The Women's team also posted a win in a one off international against Colombia in October.

I am also delighted to be able to congratulate our U19 men's team for their recent retention of the Asia Rugby U19 Championship, which brings with it qualification for their 8th World Rugby U20 Trophy, a proud record indeed.

Meanwhile our referees have been appointed to both the World Rugby Sevens Series and the associated Challenger Series, and Craig Chan blew the Asian Games Women's Final, a great accolade.

Looking ahead, we eagerly anticipate the Olympic Rugby Sevens Repechage Tournament in June in Monaco, where our Men's and Women's teams will be battling for the last elusive slot at the Paris Olympic Games, while closer to home this will be the final Cathay/HSBC Hong Kong Sevens to be held at our beloved Hong Kong Stadium before the tournament moves to the new state-of-the-art Kai Tak Sports Park in 2025. During the event, Hong Kong China will participate in a new exciting Fast 3 invitational competition for the Melrose Shield; our Men will take on Japan and China, while our Women will be up against China and Thailand in a round-robin format spanning all three days.

As we all know, rugby is a team sport, and we certainly have a great team of dedicated people who consistently devote their time, energy, and expertise to support the growth and success

of the game in Hong Kong. My sincerest thanks to all - coaches, players, managers, referees, physiotherapists, first aiders, support staff, committee members and other volunteers - who selflessly contribute to the rugby community in Hong Kong and have made today's Youth Tournament possible.

THE NEW YEAR'S DAY TOURNAMENT THEN & NOW

The first New Year's Day Youth match kicked off on 1st January 1967, when a Hong Kong side comprised of students from King George V School took on a team of students who were at boarding schools in the UK...This marked the beginning of the enduring Hong Kong vs Overseas rivalry that has become an integral part of our rugby heritage.

Among the notable names on the initial Overseas team sheet was captain Brian Forsgate. His father, Gerry Forsgate, served as the HKCR President for many years, and in his memory, the Forsgate Stand at HKFC bears his name. Brian's son David made an appearance in 1998 when he was touchingly presented with his NYD souvenir tie by his grandfather.

While the UK Schoolboys were the first champions engraved on the Middlesex Cup, the

Hong Kong boys swiftly sought revenge in the second edition of the game, with 8 KGV representatives being joined by students from the St George's military school in the victorious 1968 team.

From the start, the Tournament has held a significant place in the rugby calendar, and being selected for one of the teams has been the aspiration of every young player in Hong Kong, a sentiment that remains unchanged to this day. Over the years, many future Hong Kong China internationals have participated, as well as Graeme Morrison, Rob Scott and Tom Williams, who went on to fame with Scotland and England.

The event has evolved since its inception 56 years ago, but what hasn't changed is the magnificent setting of HKFC. As one of Asia's finest sports clubs, HKFC generously welcomes up to 2,000 players, families, and

friends to this exceptional family day.

The 2024 New Year's Day Tournament holds special significance as it follows several years profoundly impacted by the Covid pandemic. We have been delighted to see great interest from overseas students this time, which helps reinforce the tournament's traditional rivalry and flavour and elevates the level of competition.

The tournament has also given an opportunity for some of the talented young players from the recently established Hysan HKCR Academy to show their skills as they progress through the pathway with the ultimate aspiration of pulling on a Hong Kong China shirt at senior level.

The U16s Ladies will be competing for the Naylor Wright Cup donated by previous Tournament Director

Rob Naylor, whilst the U19 Ladies contest the Lassies Quaich which was presented by long-term supporter of Hong Kong youth rugby Gordon Lamb. The George White Trophy is awarded to the winner of the U16 Boys match, and originates from 1978 when it was donated by George White, a New Zealander who played for and coached Hong Kong Football Club, and also the Hong Kong U21 team.

Traditionally, the final match of the day is the U19s Hong Kong vs Overseas schoolboys playing for the Middlesex Cup, the trophy that started it all back in 1967. It is believed to have first been presented by the Middlesex Regiment of the British Army, who had a strong wartime connection with Hong Kong. The format has changed a few times down the years, moving from U18 to U19, then to U20 in 2008, and has now returned to U19.

The Boys U19 match will also provide an opportunity for Hong Kong China's coaches to identify talented players as they look ahead to next year's World Rugby U20 Trophy, the eighth time we will have participated, and a number of the members of the team that won last month's Asia Rugby U19 Championship will also be back in action on New Year's Day.

Each year, the Hong Kong rugby community looks forward to this heart-warming

occasion as one of the highlights of the calendar and a day that provides a wonderful showcase for our aspiring rugby talent. We would like to express our thanks to our hosts HKFC and our

new Youth Community partner, Hysan Development. Together, we look forward to another unforgettable New Year's Day Tournament, celebrating the talent, passion, and bright future of Hong Kong rugby.
