MEMBERS OF THE DEAF COMMUNITY SOMETIMES LACK THE SAME OPPORTUNITIES AS HEARING PEOPLE AND ARE OFTEN SEGREGATED IN SOCIETY. THE DEAF RUGBY PROGRAMME AIMS TO GIVE DEAF PEOPLE MORE OPPORTUNITIES TO MEET NEW PEOPLE, LEARN NEW THINGS AND GAIN MORE CONFIDENCE.

Supported by Standard Chartered, Friends of Asia and the Laureus Sport for Good Foundation, this programme sees more than 40 deaf youngsters attend weekly training sessions, and since 1st October 2017, HKRUCF have employed a deaf coach.
